**VACCINE** 



The Rabies Vaccination is vital in order for your dog to have the best chance of maintaining perfect health. This vaccine is also effective against the Canine Parvovirus and Canine Distemper Virus.



## **OVARIOHYSTERECTOMY SURGERY**

We recommend you discuss with your local Veterinary surgeons about the Ovariohysterectomy surgery once your dog is 6 months of age. Having the Ovariohysterectomy surgery reduces the chance of health risks for the dogs themselves, in particular protecting them from the Rabies Virus. In some cases, if your dog is in a difficult position to have this procedure done, you must keep your dog at home or in a closed-off environment. This is strongly recommended if your dog is going through an Estrous cycle.

RUBBISH



If your dog consumes any waste or garbage, there is a very high chance that they may become severely ill or in some cases even die. Maintaining a clean space and environment for your dogs to be in is extremely important.

**MEDICINE FOR TICKS AND FLEAS** 

There is liquid prevention medicine available for ticks and fleas



## MEDICINE FOR HEARTWORM

Canine Filariasis is transmitted through Mosquito bites. These worms lodge in a dog's heart and lungs, with the ability to cause heart failure or even death. To ensure this does not happen to your dog, is it important for them to have the Canine Filariasis medicine early on. Before allowing your dog to consume this medicine, please ensure that you take your dog to have a blood test at the vet.

**ADOPTION PERIOD** 

Please ensure to not adopt a puppy from their mother when they are still under 2 months of age.

This is because a puppy learns most life lessons during this period of time from their mother and siblings.

If the puppy is separated from their family at such a young age, they will face many problems along the way.

Milk from the mother provides nutritious vitamins for the puppy which protects them from various sicknesses.

HOW TO CUDDLE YOUR DOG

The best way to hold your dog is to first grab their upper torso,

just below the arms and then take one hand to support the bum from underneath.

WATER

Make certain that you are always providing clean and hygenic water to your dog.



## HOW TO SCOLD YOUR DOG



DO NOT violently kick, punch or throw objects at your dog. Your dogs life is shorter than yours! If your dog seriously bites you with all of its strength, it has enough power than the average human. Your dog trusts you, so they should listen to you at all times. If your dog misbehaves, there usually is a reason so please understand them and their feelings. Remember to always comfort your dog and give them affection if they behave themselves. They understand when their owners are happy for their good behaviour.

VET



Please take your dog to the vet if they are suffering from any of the symptoms below:

- Changes in their personality, Vomiting, Fever, Diarrhea, Loss of weight, Loss of appetite, Blood found in their feces, Consumed something poisonous and signs of shakiness or discomfort.

Additionally, if other symptoms are found in your dogs such as white eye bags and the colour of their gum turning white there is a chance that your dog may be suffering from Anemia.

Make sure to clean the affected area with clean water. If you were bitten by an unfamiliar dog, make certain that you ask the owners of the dog if they have previously had the Rabies Vaccination.

Even if the dog has had the Rabies Vaccination, please take yourself to the doctors to have a closer examination as there is a possible chance that you have a bacterial infection called Tetanus.

**ANTHELMINTIC** 

If your dog has shown signs of them not gaining any weight even after eating enough food, or having less energy than they normally do, please notify the vet to have an examination and receive suitable medicine.

WALKS

Make sure to let your dog free at least once a day during a walk. If unsure of how to walk your dog safely, watch youtube videos online that show the correct way on walking your dog so that they are comfortable in your presence. You should never force them into walking at a certain speed or direction and you should never pull or tug if your dog is on a leash. If your dog is always free-roaming, ensure that they are in a closed-off area to protect them from cars, eating poisonous foods etc.
